STHT Q&A

Clive Haynsford, owner of Racing Beat Europe, reveals exciting plans for his RX-8 race car and why The Mother Road beckons

STHT: How did your relationship with MX-5s begin?

CH: I was an apprentice at Bourne Road Garage Mazda dealership in Crayford in 1973, but my journey with

CH: We're waiting for the new Kizuna to arrive in dealerships as this could well become our dream MX-5.

STHT: Do you have a favourite early model?

CH: No, because each model is so different and appeals to many different types of owners, which has made the MX-5 such a popular model.

STHT: Can you see the MX-5 ever becoming a bona fide classic?

CH: Yes. As time goes on, each MX-5 model will become a classic in its own right.

STHT: Do you have a favourite **MX-5 Owners Club event?**

CH: We've attended a few national events, which have been excellent.

STHT: If you could drive an MX-5 anywhere in the world, where would you go?

CH: It would have to be Route 66!

STHT: Have you had a memorable on-track MX-5 experience?

CH: Probably the advent of the BRSCC Mazda MX-5 SuperCup, which we supported for several years.

STHT: Most memorable Mazda moment?

CH: Being invited to attend 24 Hours of Daytona with the US Mazda Motorsports team.

STHT: What makes the MX-5 special?

CH: Mazda always gives owners the feel of a true sports car with every model of MX-5.

STHT: How do you like to relax?

CH: What with looking after our customers and racing, I don't really have time to relax

STHT: What's your best quality?

CH: Hopefully, my faith in Mazda. I've supported the brand for many years.

STHT: And your worst?
